Community

The Village of Sparta is located 20 minutes north of Grand Rapids. This small rural town of 13,445 residents reflects the values of the community. Sparta offers a diverse labor market, employment opportunities and quality schools. Most notably, it is known for the apple trees covering thousands of acres of rolling farmland dedicated to the 3rd largest apple industry in the country.

Educational Environment

Sparta High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling approximately 850 students. The district consists of one high school, one middle school and two elementary schools that utilize K-2 and 3-5 grade level configurations.

Curriculum

The academic program during this school year is organized on an alternating A/B day schedule. The school year is divided into 2 semesters with students taking 3 courses on A days, and the other 3 courses B days. Each course is worth a . 5 credit. Students have a career exploration period called Focus incorporated into their last period class, earning a .5 credit at the end of the school year for it. Overall, students may earn 6.5 credits per year.

Courses

Over 75 courses are offered. Traditional core subjects and electives are graded on a 4.00 scale. Advanced Placement (AP) and honors courses are weighted with an additional .50. There are 10 AP courses (in a traditional classroom setting) and 9 honors-level courses available. Additional AP courses are also offered online. Note: The majority of AP courses become available to students in their junior and/or senior years, after they have met the prerequisites.
