

**School Nurse Notes** 

Medicaeconcerns – It is our goal here in Sparta to provide your children with a safe and healthy environment in which to learn. Please notify the school as soon as possible of any medical concerns that your child may have. This information will help us meet your child's medical needs here at school. Please understand that this information is kept confidential and shared on a need to know basis only.

Medication Policy – It is recommended that all medications be brought to the school by the student's parent/guardian at which time a medication administration permission form should be signed. All medication, both prescription and non-prescription (over-the counter), must be in the original container and be kept in the nurse's office. Students are not to carry any medication on themselves. Exceptions can be made for emergency medications such as asthma inhalers and EpiPens for severe allergic reactions.

Animal Free District – Due to several severe allergies in our district, we would like to remind all of our students, families and friends that Sparta Area Schools is an animal-free district. Please do not bring animals into our buildings without prior approval from administration. Service dogs are always welcome. Thank you for helping us provide all of our students with a healthy and safe environment in which to learn.

Latex Free District – Due to several severe allergies in our district, we would like to remind all of our students, families and friends that Sparta Area Schools is a latex-free district. Please do not bring latex balloons into our buildings. Mylar balloons are welcome. Thank you for helping us provide all of our students with a healthy and safe environment in which to learn.

ZONES OF REGULATION

Hello families, students, all. The '23/'24 school year is off to a fabulous start!

My main goal at the beginning of the year is to help support children's transition into/back into school. Waking early, getting out the door, early car or bus rides, being away from you and home/with new adults and children, sitting, learning: it can all be difficult. I will partner with your child, you, your child's teachers, and our school staff to make sure he/she has the tools to succeed academically and socially.

Beginning in October, Ashley Nowland, our school social worker, and I will be visiting classrooms. In grades 1-2 we will be conducting our Universal Wellness Screener\*. It serves as a feeling 'temperature gauge'. In all grades, we will be teaching the Zones of Regulation and social/emotional lessons from the Michigan Model for Health. Administering the wellness survey, teaching students how to regulate their emotions and behavior, and enriching students' social and emotional skills through lessons are part of our continued effort to prioritize social/emotional well-being in our District.

Students in all grades will learn about the Zones of Regulation; this will help them to identify and manage emotions. We have talked about 'regulating' emotions is like dialing in a new radio station if we don't like the one that is playing. I will teach students tools to 'dial in new emotions', including taking deep breaths, counting to 10, getting a drink of water, crunchy caterpillar, getting hugs, and more. Consider talking about more ways to manage emotions with your children. ��
